

EMIS Change 25-61

This change adds new options for the Core Area Code and the Subject Area for Credit. These codes will allow districts to indicate when English, math, science, and social studies credits are being counted toward a student's electives for the state graduation requirements, indicating that this credit should not be counted toward the student's specifically required credits in those areas.
